## Triple Play (3 Hand) Ultimate X 6/5 Bonus Simplified Strategy

 Approach

## Note: This will be a simple 3 step process to approach each deal

- Step 1: See if it is one of the 16 types of deal to play Ultimate X Strategy. If so, play the Ultimate X Strategy
- Step 2: Observe the Multipliers on the board. Add them up with no multiplier counting as 1 (one).
- Step 3: If it is $3 x-13 x$, use the Ultimate $X$ Weighted Strategy. If it is $14 x-36 x$ then use Conventional Strategy


## Step 1: Ultimate X Holds Over Conventional Strategy at ANY Time

IMPORTANT NOTES: Regardless of the Multiplier in place, these are Ultimate X Strategy holds that are different than Conventional strategy should be played. The multiplier potential is great enough to make the change from Conventional strategy.

1. Aces-Full Full House over Three of a Kind Aces
2. AKJQ over 3 to Straight Flush $8 J Q[A \bullet 8 \bullet J \bullet Q \bullet K ~ \&]$
3. 3 to Straight Flush No Gap No High Card 345 thru 678 over 2 to Royal Flush KQ\KJ
4. 3 to Straight Flush No Gap No High Card 89T over 2 to Royal Flush KQ
5. 3 to Straight Flush No Gap No High Card 345 over 2 to Royal Flush AK\AQ\AJ
6. 3 to Straight Flush No Gap No High Card 789 over 2 to Royal Flush AJ
7. 4 to Inside Straight 10 Thru Ace over 2 to Royal Flush AK\AQ\AJ
8. 3 to Straight Flush 2 Gap 1 High Card $78 J$ over Unsuited QJ
9. 3 to Straight Flush 2 Gap 1 High Card 78T/78J/79J over Unsuited QK
10. 3 to Straight Flush 1 Gap 0 High Card 568/578/679 over Unsuited QJ
11. 3 to Straight Flush 1 Gap 0 High Card 234/235/245/346/356/457/467/679 over 2 to Royal Flush JT
12. 4 to Inside Straight with 2 High Cards over Unsuited KQ\KJ\QJ
13. 3 to Straight Flush 1 Gap 0 High Card 234 and 235 thru 79T over Ace with Straight Penalty to SF
14. 3 to Straight Flush 1 Gap 0 High Card 234/235/245/346/356 over Jack with Straight Penalty to SF
15. 2 to Royal Flush QT over Unsuited AQ with no 8 or 9 present
16. 4 to Inside Straight with No High Cards over Discard All

## Step 2: Information: Statistics Chart on Multiplier Transitions

There are 364,368 deals out of $2,598,960$ five card deals that have different strategy holds on Ultimate $X$ than the 20/12/10 Deuces Wild Conventional Strategy, but when the multiplier gets high enough the Conventional Strategy is a better play.

Single Hand Ultimate $\mathbf{X}$ has $\mathbf{3 0}$ Multiplier Possibilities ranging from 3x to 36x
Multiplier Transition:

- When the Multiplier is $6 x, 216672$ out of 364368 (59.47\%) Ultimate $X$ Strategy is a better play than Conventional Strategy
- When the Multiplier is $9 x, 60816$ out of 364368 (16.69\%) Ultimate X Strategy is a better play than Conventional Strategy
- When the Multiplier is $12 x, 39456$ out of 364368 (10.83\%) Ultimate $X$ Strategy is a better play than Conventional Strategy
- When the Multiplier is $13 x, 28308$ out of 364368 (7.7\%) Ultimate $X$ Strategy is a better play than Conventional Strategy
- When the Multiplier is $14 x, 23604$ out of 364368 (6.48\%) Ultimate X Strategy is a better play than Conventional Strategy
- When the Multiplier is $15 x, 22848$ out of 364368 (6.27\%) Ultimate $X$ Strategy is a better play than Conventional Strategy

A suggested simplified approach will be: When the multiplier is $3 x$ to $13 x$, take the Ultimate $X$ Strategy approach. When the multiplier is $14 x$ or greater, play the Conventional Strategy since it will be the right play for $93.52 \%$ of the transitional hands.

## Step 3: Strategy Chart for Single Hand Play (this strategy should be played when there is $3 x-13 x$ TOTAL on the board)
